Please follow up on your application and call the FWC office at (208) 843-9376 or a commissioner before picking up the fish. Fish for funerals of Nez Perce enrolled members will be automatically approved. Ceremonial salmon is to be picked up at the FWC office, 315 "B" Street, Lapwai, ID.

qua nev <u>cor</u> fish suf	Ceremonial spring chinook salmon was caught May 2017. Proper thawing of frozen fish is important to maintaining fish lity. We recommend thawing frozen fish in the refrigerator for up to 2 days before cooking (rotating fish as needed), and er thaw fish in hot water or at room temperature. Care is taken to provide you with quality ceremonial salmon. If you have cerns about the quality of the fish you receive, immediately contact Nancy McAllaster at (208) 843-9376 ext. 4649, and will be exchanged if time allows. In some cases, the seal on the plastic bag may break resulting in the fish drying (or ering "freezer burn") on the edges; if that has occurred, the dried edges may be cut and removed before preparing the fish. vever, if the fish smells bad, DO NOT cook the fish, return it to the FWC immediately for replacement before event.
