The HISTORY *Of* VETERANS DAY

In 1918 an armistice was declared between the Allied nations and Germany during World War I. The armistice began on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. We celebrate Veteran's Day on the anniversary of the armistice that signaled the end of World War I.

November 11th became a federal holiday in the United States in 1938. In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War, the holiday became known as Veterans Day. Veterans Day is a holiday observed annually in the United States in honor of all those, living and dead, who served with the U.S. armed forces in wartime.

Some states observe the holiday on November 11th and others on

the fourth Monday of October. Armistice Day, the forerunner of Veterans' Day, was proclaimed in 1919 to commemorate the termination (at 11:00 a.m. on November 11, 1918) World War I. On the first anniversary of the truce, U.S. President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation eulogizing fallen Allied soldiers and referring to November 11th as Armistice Day. It became a holiday in the United States, France, Great Britain, and Canada.

The holiday acquired its present name and broadened significance in the United States in 1954. In Canada it is known as Remembrance Day, and in Great Britain, it is known as Remembrance Sunday.

Cpl. Frank W. Penney, Lapwai, who spent more than three years as a Japanese prisoner of war, has arrived at the Miami Beach resort for a two-week vacation, accompanied by his mother, Mrs. Stella Penney, and brother, Ben, according to a release received last night from the public relations office at Miami. The trio are staying at one of the beach-front hotels as guests of the army air forces with all expenses paid.

Cpl. Penney was captured on Bataan April 11, 1942, and worked in a coal mine during his internment. The 30 pounds he lost during his prison ordeal has been regained since coming home in October.

The corporal plans to return to school upon discharge.

Moffett, Kamiah, have been notified. He entered the army in February, 1944, and has been overseas since August with an infantry unit.

Pvt. Hi Moffett Among Liberated

Pvt. Hiram (Hi) W. Moffett, Kamiah, a German prisoner of war, has been liberated and returned to "military control on April 29," according to a war department telegram received by his parents, the Rev. and Mrs. Harry Moffett, Kamiah, from Maj. Gen. J. A. Ulio, adjutant general.

Pvt. Moffett was reported missing in action somewhere in Belgium on Dec. 23. Last month his parents received a card from him in a German prison camp.

A star basketball player at the Kamiah high school, Pvt. Moffett entered the army in February, 1944, and received his basic infantry training at Camp Roberts, Calif. He was sent overseas last August.

Two Nez Perce Indian—Pvt. Alvin Amera, son of Charlie Amera, Stites, and Pvt. Frank Penny, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ben Penny, Lapwai—are prisoners of the Japanese on the Philippine islands, according to information received yesterday from Washington, D. C. Relatives expressed relief when the information came they were prisoners. The last letter received by relatives was in 1941, and it was feared they had met death in action. Penny is the nephew of Amera. They enlisted at the same time.

Flag Rules and Regulations - How to Display the Flag



1. When the flag is displayed over the middle of the street, it should be suspended vertically with the union to the north in an east and west street or to the east in a north and south street.

2. The flag of the United States of America, when it is displayed with another flag against a wall from crossed staffs, should be on the right, the flag's own right [*that means the viewer's left -- Webmaster*], and its staff should be in front of the staff of the other flag.



3. The flag, when flown at half-staff, should be first hoisted to the peak for an instant and then lowered to the half-staff position. The flag should be again raised to the peak before it is lowered for the day. By "half-staff" is meant lowering the flag to one-half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff. Crepe streamers may be affixed to spear heads or flagstaves in a parade only by order of the President of the United States.

4. When flags of States, cities, or localities, or pennants of societies are flown on the same halyard with the flag of the United States, the latter should always be at the peak. When the flags are flown from adjacent staffs, the flag of the United States should be hoisted first and lowered last. No such flag or pennant may be placed above the flag of the United States or to the right of the flag of the United States.



5. When the flag is suspended over a sidewalk from a rope extending from a house to a pole at the edge of the sidewalk, the flag should be hoisted out, union first, from the building.

6. When the flag of the United States is displayed from a staff projecting horizontally or at an angle from the window sill, balcony, or front of a building, the union of the flag should be placed at the peak of the staff unless the flag is at half-staff.



7. When the flag is used to cover a casket, it should be so placed that the union is at the head and over the left shoulder. The flag should not be lowered into the grave or allowed to touch the ground.

8. When the flag is displayed in a manner other than by being flown from a staff, it should be displayed flat, whether indoors or out. When displayed either horizontally or vertically against a wall, the union should be uppermost and to the flag's own right, that is, to the observer's left. When displayed in a window it should be displayed in the same way, that is with the union or blue field to the left of the observer in the street. When festoons, rosettes or drapings are desired, bunting of blue, white and red should be used, but never the flag.



9. That the flag, when carried in a procession with another flag, or flags, should be either on the marching right; that is, the flag's own right, or, if there is a line of other flags, in front of the center of that line.



10. The flag of the United States of America should be at the center and at the highest point of the group when a number of flags of States or localities or pennants of societies are grouped and displayed from staffs.



11. When flags of two or more nations are displayed, they are to be flown from separate staffs of the same height. The flags should be of approximately equal size. International usage forbids the display of the flag of one nation above that of another nation in time of peace.



12. When displayed from a staff in a church or public auditorium, the flag of the United States of America should hold the position of superior prominence, in advance of the audience, and in the position of honor at the clergyman's or speaker's right as he faces the audience. Any other flag so displayed should be placed on the left of the clergyman or speaker or to the right of the audience.
