RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Nez Perce Tribal Executive Committee has been empowered to act for and on behalf of the Nez Perce Tribe, pursuant to the Revised Constitution and Bylaws, adopted by the General Council of the Nez Perce Tribe, on May 6, 1961 and approved by the Acting Commissioner of Indian Affairs on June 27, 1961; and

- WHEREAS, Article VI, Section 1, of the Revised Constitution and Bylaws of the Nez Perce Tribe (Tribe) provides that the affairs of the Nez Perce Tribe shall be administered by the Nez Perce Tribal Executive Committee (NPTEC); and
- WHEREAS, the NPTEC has a responsibility under the Tribal Constitution to promote and protect the health, education, and general welfare of the members of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe was awarded a grant from the U.S. Department of Justice to revitalize the Nez Perce Tribal Code to a state of efficiency, effectiveness, and easily-accessible ("Code Revision Grant"); and
- WHEREAS, the Code Revision Grant team presented Title 7 Domestic Violence as a major subject area for revision and reorganization; and
- WHEREAS, the proposed amendments to the Nez Perce Tribal Code, Title 7 Domestic Violence, specifically, Chapters:
 - 7-1 (General Provisions);
 - 7-2 (Criminal Penalties and Procedures);
 - 7-3 (Civil Domestic Protection Orders); and
 - 7-4 (Family and Children)
- WHEREAS, chapter 7-5 (Elder and Adult Protection) will be reviewed in conjunction with chapters related to family and community; and
- NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that having opened an extended comment period of 90 days, and having considered comments received, the NPTEC hereby authorizes the amendments to the chapters listed above; and

- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED those amendments are effective one week from the date of the original resolution, dated March 22, 2022; EXCEPT for amendments related to the exercise of jurisdiction over non-Indians for certain covered crimes; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED those amendments related to the exercise of jurisdiction over non-Indians for certain covered crimes will require additional planning, implementation, and notice; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED those amendments related to the exercise of jurisdiction over non-Indians for certain covered crimes shall become effective on October 1, 2024; and
- BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the NPTEC Chairman and Secretary are hereby authorized to sign all necessary correspondence and the NPTEC Treasurer is hereby authorized to disburse funds accordingly.
